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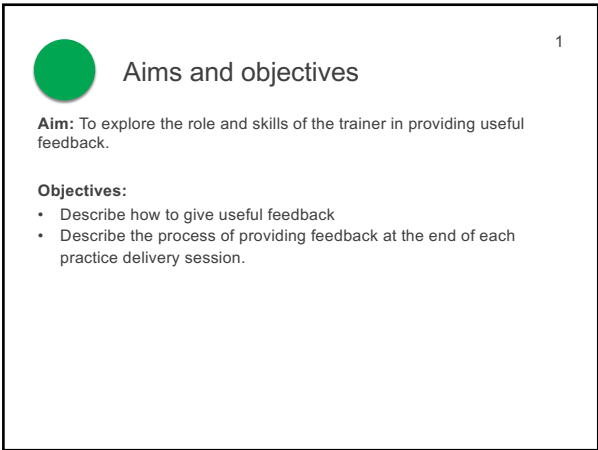

- Describe the process of providing feedback at the end of each practice delivery session.

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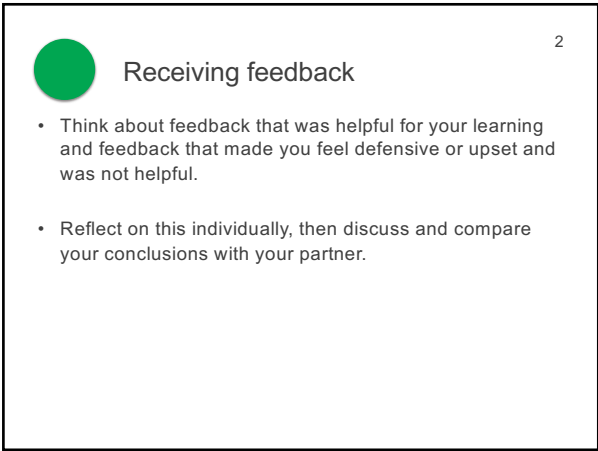
